Dear Esteemed Stake Holders of our Profession



ABOUT VARANASI

Varanasi (ancient names Kashi/Banaras, located on western bank of the holy river Ganges, is one of the oldest living cities in World with a history of more than 5000 years. Believed to be sitting atop the trident of Lord Shiva, through the ages Varanasi was variously known as Avimukta, Anand Kahana, Mahashmasana, Surandhana, Brahma Vardha, Sudarshana, Ramya and Kashi. Hindu Mythological beliefs accord a very prestigious & ritualistic importance to Kashi; it is regarded as one of Hinduism's seven holy cities. The city of joy Varanasi is also the Mahashmasana as here Shiva bestows on the dying wisdom which leads to Moksha (liberation from the cycle of birth and death). The city is best understood in intellectual, spiritual, and religious terms rather than historical and political ones.


In words of American writer Mark Twain "Varanasi is older than history, older than tradition, older even than legend, and looks twice as old as all of them put together".

All the 330 million Gods of the Hindu pantheon and all the Tirthas of the subcontinent are said to be present in the City. The permanent abode of Lord Shiva has also been the home of eminent saints and thinkers like Maharshi Dhaum, Uddalak, Paranjali, Panini, Shukdeo, Shankaracharya, Buddha, Tulsi, Kabir, and many others. While Varanasi is one of the four holiest places in Buddhism (other other three being Kushinagar, Bodhgaya and Lumbini), it is also the birth place of four Tirthankars in Jainism namely; Suparshwanath (7th), Chandraprabhu (8th), Shreyansnath (11th) and Parshwanath (23rd).

The city of joy Varanasi has fascinated all, its braces visitor's from across world, binds them to its chaos, simple yet happy residents, and is so own that even a stranger connects it like they have some connection decades old. Varanasi is unique, and a walk along the ghats or a boat ride on the river will live long in the memory.

ATTRACTIONS & INFORMATION

FOR DELEGATES

Ancient Chinese travelers Fa Hien and Huen Tsang were as entranced by the city as the millions of tourists from across the world. There are thousands of places of interest in the mystical Kashi, but some prominent are mentioned hereunder:

River Bank and Ghats:

The Ghats of the city embody the real essence of this timeless city. As the first rays of sun touch the placid waters of the holy river at dawn and the sun spread across the river and strike the high banked face of the city, it mesmerizes every one. There are more than 80 Ghats at the river front and interestingly each has a history and story to relate.

Subah-e-Banaras and Ganga Aarti:

This magnificent Arti performed at Assi Ghat daily in morning and Subah-e-Banaras, thereafter Ganga Arti at Shitala Ghat near Dashashwamedh Ghat daily in the evening are worth watching and an unforgettable experience.

Sarnath:

After gaining enlightenment at Bodhgaya, Gautam Buddha came to Ishiptana or the Deer Park of today's Sarnath 2500 years ago where he gave his first sermon. Apart from various spots of archaeological and historical importance, the Museum, Dhammekh Stupa, Chaukhandi Stupa, the Mulgandha Kuti Vihara and other temples like Tibetan Temple, Korean Temple, Japanese Temple and Thai Temples are the most important places of attraction.

Nearby Locations

Ramnagar, famous for its legendry Ram Lila, is a small town across the river and is glorified by the Fort on the eastern bank of Ganges. Its museum is the repository of the history of the kings of Banaras.

Approximately 35 Kms from Varanasi, Chunar has a medieval Fort overlooking the river Ganges. The fort has stood witness to the history from Raja Bhatrihari of Ujjain to the conflict between Afghans and the Mughals.

Approximately 80 Kms. From Varanasi, Vindhyawasini temple is dedicated to goddess Vindhyavasini (one of Shakti Pith) and others two Ashtabhuji and Kalikhoh. These temples make Vindhyachal a major pilgrim destination.

TEMPLES OF KASHI

Kashi Vishwanath Temple:

Dedicated to Lord Shiva, the presiding deity of the city the temple was accorded its present form in 1777 by Maharani Ahilyabai Holker of Indore.

The top portion is plated with 820 Kgs of gold given by Maharaja Ranjit Singh in 1839. The Shivalinga in the temple is amongst the 12 Jyotirlingas and is worshiped by five principal Aarties during a day starting early in the morning till late night. The other important temples in the near vicinity are Sakshi Vinayak Temple, Annapurna Temple, Kaal Bhairav Temple, Shani Dev Temple and Maha Mrityunjaya Temple.

Durga Temple

Built during 18th century the temple is dedicated to goddess Durga, the epitome of power in Hindu mythology. The temple constructed in Nagra style architecture symbolizes that this world of five elements has ultimately to merge with supreme, the Brahma.

Sankat Mochan:

The temple dedicated to Lord Hanuman, was build by Sant Tulsidas. Another temple of Lord Ram, Sita and Laxman is also situated inside the same premises, which is also used for marriage ceremonies. The venue is also popular for religious discourses and annual music festival.

Tulsi Manas Mandir:

Constructed by a philanthropist family of Kolkata in 1964, the temple is devoted to Lord Ram. The entire marble structure is inscribed with quartets and couplets from the Ramcharitmanas, written by Sant Tulsidas.

New Vishwanath Temple:

The white marble temple in the Banaras Hindu University campus, approx one km from the conference venue, is said to be the replica of the Vishwanath temple destroyed by Auyrangzeb. It is managed by the reputed industrial house of Birlas. Originally conceptualized by Pt. Madan Mohan Malviya, the founder of BHU, the sanctum has a Lingam and verses from Hindu scriptures inscribed on its walls.

Bharat Mata Temple:

Instead of the customary Gods and Goddesses this temple is dedicated to Mother India. It houses a perfect map of undivided India, carved out of marble. The temple was gifted by the patriots like Shiv Prasad Gupta.

Jain Temples:

Being birth place of four Tirthankars namely; Suparshwanath (7th), Chandraprabhu (8th), Shreyanshnath (11th) and Parshwanath (23rd), Varanasi is one of the holiest places in Jainism. Each birth place is being worshiped by the Jains all across the world and at each place there are temples, which are known for its architecture and sanctity. While the temples at Bhelupura, birth place of Parshwanath and at Bhadaini birth place of Suparshwanath are in the city, the temples of Chandrawati, the birth place of Chandraprabhu and Singhpuri (Sarnath), the birth place of Shreyanshnath are located at the outskirts of city.

CENTRE FOR LEARNING AND EDUCATION:

Varanasi, which is well known for learning and education since ancient period, has as many as three full fledged universities – Banaras Hindu University, Mahatma Gandhi Kashi Vidyapith and Sampurnanand Sanskrit University.

LOCAL CULTURE:

The place has a mesmerising culture in field of art and music, Banarasi Music has swayed the world and many reputed personalities Padma Shree "Sitara Devi", Bharat Rattan "Bismillah Khan", Padam bhushan "Girija Devi"have their roots in Varanasi. In "Ateendriya Bodh "our endeavour is to pay an ode to the rich cultural heritage of the City ,and the tradition they have given to the city. We have roped in international fame Artists including Shri Manoj Tiwari, Member of Parliament for the cultural night for an enthralling experience, along with classical dances, shiv tandav stroatam , tarana, kathak dances, Jugalbandi, cricket in kathak etc.

HOTELACCOMMODATION:

Varanasi being a tourist city, it offers variety of accommodation starting from ethnic Dharamshalas, modern villas (guest houses), budget hotels and five star Hotels. We have negotiated best possible rates with many budget and star hotels, guest houses (including BHU guest houses) within 1 to 8 Kms, estimated tariff ranging from 1500/- per day to 5500/- per day on double occupancy basis. And we expect to negotiate further.

CONNECTIVITY:

Air: Lal Bahadur Shastri International Airport in Babatpur is about 27 Kilometers from the Venue and connects it with almost all major cities of India with daily flights operated by Air India, Indigo, Spice Jet, Jet Airways, Jet Lite, etc.

Rail: Varanasi is well connected with rest of the country by Rail route through two major Railway Stations of Varanasi Cantt (7 Km from Venue) and Mughalsarai Jn. (23 from the Venue).

Road: Situated at the confluence of National Highways No-2, 7, 29, 56 and other States Highways, Varanasi is well connected with all the major cities of India.

ABOUT VARANASI BRANCH
